

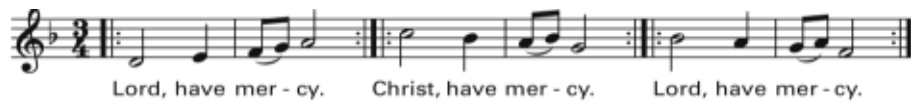
## PENITENTIAL ACT
